

OVERVIEW OF THE METROPOLITAN AREA OF GREATER

HALIFAX

Welcome to the Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM), centrally located within the province of Nova Scotia, on the east coast of Atlantic Canada. The municipality, encompassing a territory of 5,490 km2, was incorporated in 1996 following the amalgamation of Halifax, Dartmouth, Bedford, Sackville and the remainder of Halifax County. Halifax, the provincial capital, and has more than 403,131 residents, or 43.6% of the province's total population. Mostly English speaking, Halifax is also home to more than 10,000 Acadians and Francophones (2.5% of the population) who are proud of their culture, language, and heritage, in addition to approximately 50,000 people who claim the ability to communicate in French.

Halifax is the largest urban center in Atlantic Canada, the most populous city on the east coast of Canada and the second largest coastal city in the country after Vancouver, British Columbia. All major roadways converge on Halifax.

FRANCOPHONE COMMUNITY

The Conseil communautaire du Grand-Havre (CCGH), the French-language community organization for the metro area, plays a crucial role in the promotion of French language and culture in the region. The organization's mission is to promote the cultural, linguistic and social development of the French speaking community of the Halifax area. The CCGH organizes a wide range of community activities throughout the year and organizes a monthly Francophone happy hour the third Thursday of each month, alternating locations between Halifax and Dartmouth.

FRANCOPHONE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

There are seven French first-language schools under the jurisdiction of the Conseil scolaire acadien provincial (CSAP) within the Halifax Regional Municipality: 5 elementary schools and 2 high schools (from grade 6 to 12).

FRANCOPHONE UNIVERSITY/COLLEGE CAMPUS

Université Sainte-Anne, the only French-language post-secondary institution in Nova Scotia, offers college and university programs from five campuses in the following locations: Halifax, Petit-de-Grat, Church Point, Saint-Joseph-du-Moine, and Tusket. The head office is located at Church Point, in the Municipality of the District of Clare.

The Halifax campus offers the following programs: administration, arts, education, health professions, continuing education, adult learning programs, as well as French as a second language courses. People born outside Canada (and who meet the eligibility criteria) can benefit from the training and work experience program for Francophone immigrants. During the 2017-2018 academic year, 1,650 students were enrolled at the Halifax campus.

The metropolitan area of Halifax is an important educational center in Atlantic Canada. About 37,000 students are enrolled in the eight post-secondary institutions of Greater Halifax. In addition to Université Sainte-Anne and the Nova Scotia Community College campuses, six English language universities are located in the Halifax area: Atlantic School of Theology, Nova Scotia College of Art and Design, Dalhousie University, University of King's College, Mount Saint Vincent University, and Saint Mary's University.
