

OVERVIEW OF RICHMOND COUNTY

ISLE MADAME

Welcome to Richmond County, located in southeastern Cape Breton Island. The Municipality of the County of Richmond is home to some 8,964 residents, representing approximately 1% of Nova Scotia's total population. While Richmond County is largely English-speaking (66.7%), there is a strong, proud Acadian presence throughout the county with 33.2% of residents able to communicate in French.

The Municipality of the County of Richmond is comprised of three subdivisions with the most significant number of French-speaking residents located within subdivision 'C' on Isle Madame.

SELF-EMPLOYMENT AND BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

In Richmond County, opportunities abound for persons to become self-employed, to take the path of entrepreneurship, or even to acquire an existing business. Self-employed individuals include business owners, free-lancers, and fixed fee/contract workers. FRANCOPHONE COMMUNITY

The Picasse, the community and cultural center, was built in Petit-de-Grat in 1996-1997. This francophone multi-purpose center houses the northeastern regional offices of the Conseil scolaire acadien provincial (CSAP), the Conseil de développement économique de la Nouvelle-Écosse (CDÉNÉ), Service Canada, the local campus of Université Sainte-Anne, a regional library, and a community radio station (Radio Richmond). The Picasse organizes and coordinates French-language activities on a year-round basis for residents and visitors alike.

FRANCOPHONE/ACADIAN SCHOOL

École Beau-Port, the CSAP school located in Arichat, offers a quality French first-language education from pre-school to grade 12. It also houses a Frenchlanguage day care and a community fitness facility.

FRANCOPHONE UNIVERSITY/COLLEGE CAMPUS

A satellite campus of Université Sainte-Anne is located in Petit-de-Grat. Adult learners may participate in collegiate and university programs, as well as local offerings such as 'learn to speak French' sessions. This campus is also home to the Centre de recherche marine (marine research center) which plays an important role in local fisheries, aquaculture, and ecological initiatives.

MOST PREVALENT OCCUPATIONS AND TRADES, RICHMOND COUNTY

Most occupations in Richmond County are in the service (tertiary) industry. The employment rate is 52.1% while the labour force participation rate is 43.5%. The unemployment rate is 16.4% in this area where there are 280 self-employed individuals.
